364 interviews have been sold from the 2008 introduction through Oct 8, 2013.

(We don't have totals sold at conventions, but I believe the numbers are fairly small.)

Harry Hirsch produces two-minute clips of each interview for use in marketing the DVDs, and AES CIO Steve Johnson places these "trailers" on <u>YouTube</u>. Over 120 interviews have been conducted by Irv Joel and others.

The Committee's Technical Advisor John Chester manages our recording equipment, setup, and videography along with the backup archive of our recordings.
