

CALL FOR AWARDS NOMINATIONS

The AES recognizes and honors those who have made outstanding contributions to the audio field in engineering, technology, service, and the arts through its Awards Program. All AES members worldwide are eligible for the various awards listed below. Nonmembers of distinction are eligible for honorary membership.

The procedure is as follows: Nominees are presented by the members and officers of the AES to the Awards Committee on a continuing basis. In addition, AES Section Chairs are hereby requested to send in names of outstanding local chapter members. The Committee will consider the nominees, validate credentials and contributions, confirm the award categories, and prepare a slate of recipients to be approved by the Board of Governors. Awards will be presented at a special ceremony during the forthcoming AES conventions in Amsterdam and San Francisco.

The committee is eager to learn of all those who deserve recognition in the audio field. Therefore, we are calling for AES Awards Nominees through the *Journal*.

AWARDS GUIDELINES

HONORARY MEMBERS: A person of outstanding reputation and eminence in the science of audio engineering or its allied arts. The endorsement of ten members is required.

CITATIONS are given in recognition of services or accomplishments that do not fit into any of the following categories.

THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AWARD is often given to past convention and conference chairs in recognition of their contribution to the Society. It is also given to AES sections officers for outstanding long-term contributions.

FELLOWS: A member who has rendered conspicuous service, or is recognized to have made a valuable contribution to the advancement in or dissemination of the knowledge of audio engineering, or in the promotion of its application in practice. Requires endorsement of five members.

THE BRONZE MEDAL AWARD was established by the Society in 1971 and is given in recognition of significant service in the advancement of the Society. Must be a member for at least five years and possess a Fellowship in the Society.

THE SILVER MEDAL AWARD, established by the Society in 1971, in honor of audio pioneers Alexander Graham Bell, Emile Berliner, and Thomas A. Edison, is given in recognition of outstanding development or achievement in the field of audio engineering. Must be a member for at least five years and possess a Fellowship in the Society.

THE GOLD MEDAL AWARD, established by the Society in 1971, is given in recognition of outstanding achievements, sustained over a period of years, in the field of audio engineering. Must be a member for at least ten years and possess a Fellowship in the Society.

THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE MEDAL AWARD, established by the Society in 1991, is given in recognition of extraordinary service to the Society over a period of more than ten years. Must be a member for at least five years and possess a Fellowship in the Society.
